

2020-2021 Southern Oregon Latino Scholarship Fund Scholarship Application

"Empowering Young Latino Minds"

The Southern Oregon Latino Scholarship Fund provides opportunities for Latinx/Hispanic students living in the Southern Oregon region to complete their post high school career/degree goals. This scholarship's primary aim is to build leadership in our region's communities. To be eligible for this Southern Oregon Latino Scholarship Fund Scholarship, a complete application and required documents must be emailed **on or before March 6, 2020 by 11:59PM.** Entering freshmen and continuing college students seeking their **first** academic degree, and students in an accredited technical training program that leads to licensure may apply.

Award Amounts: \$1000 a year for a 4-year university, \$500 a year for a community college.

General Applicant Requirements:

- Must be a resident of Jackson, Josephine or Klamath counties and be of Latinx heritage.
- ♦ Must be enrolled <u>full time</u> in the state of <u>Oregon</u> at an accredited community college, technical institute, or public/private university for the 2020-2021 academic year
- ♦ Must have a minimum of 3.00 cumulative high school grade point average <u>or</u> a minimum combined verbal and math score of 1010 on the Scholastic Aptitude Test I (SAT I) <u>or</u> a minimum of 21 on the American College Test (ACT).
- Continuing college students must have a minimum of a 3.00 cumulative grade point average.

Scholarship Renewal Process

- This scholarship may be renewable for up to 4 years, upon meeting program requirements.
- During the academic year, scholarship recipients must complete an approved community service activity.

Required Application Materials:

- Submit a scanned **official** high school <u>or</u> scanned **official** college transcript together with a completed application and a personal statement essay in the same email. (See Parts I, II)
- ◆ Completed Activities Chart (Can include own chart if has the same information) (See Part III)
- ◆ Two applicant recommendations. (See Part IV)
